AUGUST 01, 2024 -Legislative Action on Climate Change

In May and June of 2024, the NYS Senate and Assembly passed the **Climate Change** Superfund Act. This act will aim to establish the climate change adaptation cost recovery program and the climate change adaptation fund. This will be done by making polluting companies pay for damages caused to New Yorkers, which will raise an anticipated \$3 billion per year. The bill now awaits Governor Hochul's signature.

A less than positive legislative update: the NYS Assembly failed to pass the NY Home Energy Affordable Transition (NY HEAT) Act. This act aimed to lower home energy bills for low-to-moderate income households in New York by capping their energy bills at 6% of their earnings. This would save families vast amounts of money and help to reduce emissions. The act has now returned to the Assembly months after its initial return to the Senate.
